**Information:**

· eHall Pass: Introduced to faculty last week at staff meeting. Discussed how to roll out to students. Shared information through homeroom and via email. Students were ready to roll on Monday, April 29. Some more features are being utilized, like AutoPass.

Will work if students are late for school, too. Students can create the pass while they're waiting to sign in. AutoPass will work in the cafeteria, also. If a student doesn't have a phone, other devices can be used...a laptop, a kiosk? It also works for Detentions! eHall Pass is primarily a safety issue. Pilot will run through the end of the school year. Survey will go out at the end of the year (parents and students). Look at an addition to the Handbook in October 2019.

### **Discussion:**

- Textbook Review: New text is being ordered for Earth Science. Text will be used for two different classes. (Meteorology/Astrology and Oceanography/Geology). Will be ordered for the Fall of 2019. Went through the Compliance Worksheet, accepted.

- Student Handbook:

- \*Will B. will check with advisors to clarify list of clubs and activities.

- \*Revisions: Electronic Devices-language is more clear.

- \*Earbuds-in the hallway one has to be out of the ear. In the classroom, at the discretion of the teacher.

- \*New heading-Caring for the Safety of Others-language is more clear. Amy Dubovick suggests adding some language that indicates a Report of Harm may take some time to report back to. Suggested to add language that includes calling the police in case of emergency.

- Fitness Requirements-changing to just 1.5 credits

- Removal of Class Officers-add language regarding an officer being able to run again after having been removed for some reason. Also added language in the case a class officer is suspended from school. Also change the language to '....eligible to run in the next election'. Change this in E. and F.
